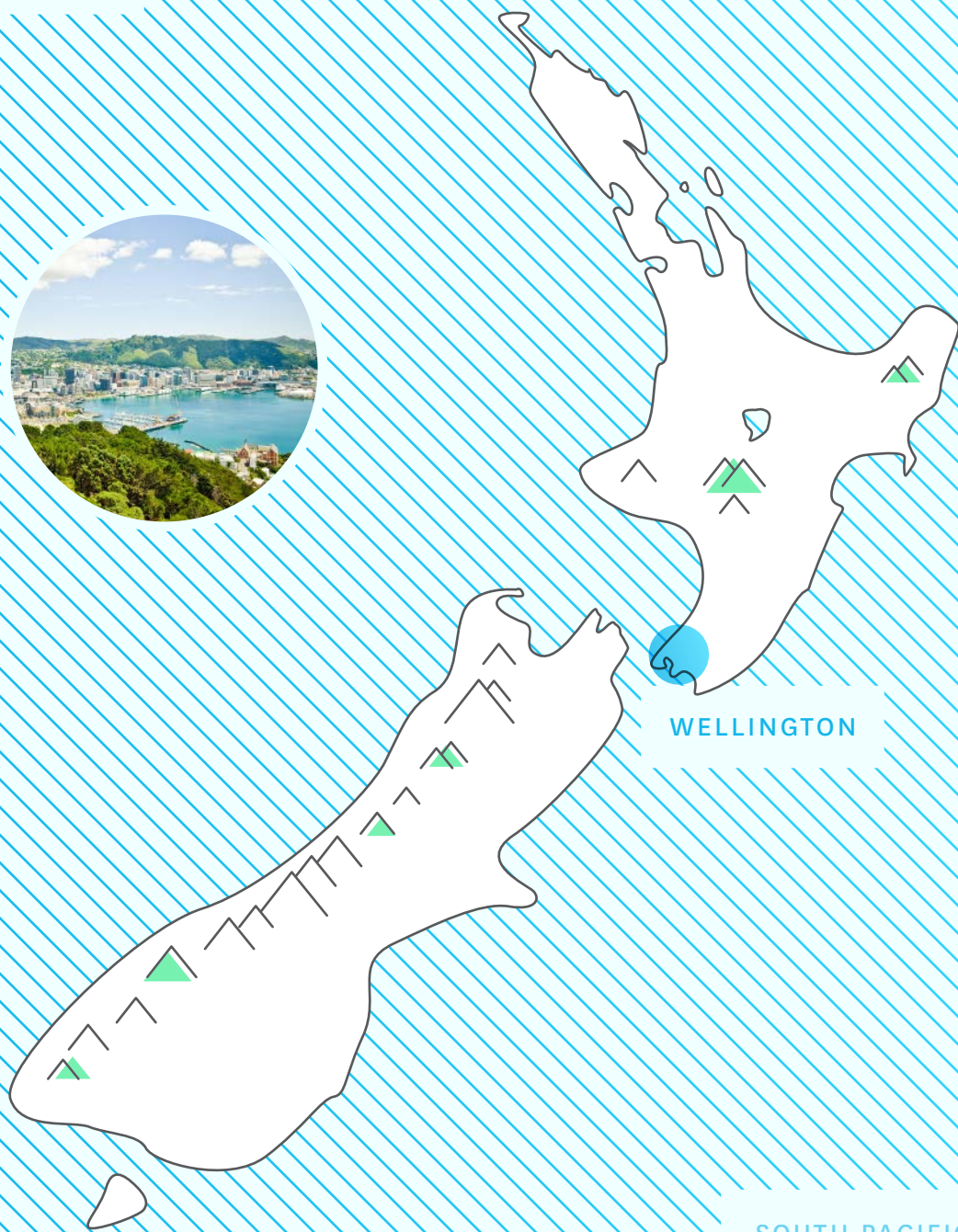


## The dev guide to Wellington
